We work closely with the local police, sheriff's office, fire departments and other volunteer Search and Rescue agencies assisting with a variety of emergencies and events across the Boulder County area and surrounding communities.

Oral Board Interviews

Interviews will be held at the Longmont Emergency Unit station. At the time of the interview, applicants will need to bring the following items:

1. Valid Colorado Driver's License
2. Social Security Card **OR** birth certificate
3. \$30 exact cash **OR** check (made out to Longmont Emergency Unit). We ask that all applicants pay the initial fee for their background checks.

**Background checks are run through a third party group.

- Traffic Control for Accident Scenes, Crime Scenes and special Events
- Evidence Searches (Metal detectors; ground and in-water)
- Medical Standby for Special Events
- Fire Support Services and Air Cascade Operations
- Response to Motor Vehicle Accidents
- Crime Scene and Accident Scene Lighting

AT THE STATION...

Outside of paged calls and providing support, LEU members participate in weekly duty crews, trainings, meetings, and events.

Weekly Duty Crews—every Friday evening (8pm-12am) and Saturday (12pm-12am) we have a group of 2-3 members that in-service for the city of Longmont. That group will be at the station doing chores, truck checks, and listening to the radio to help with some calls. We ask folks to sign up for at least full weekends (fri & sat) each quarter when the schedule is open.

Meetings/trainings—every Monday evening there is a training or a meeting; each night is a different type of training: Business meeting, water training, medical training, and general training.

Events/special assignments—LEU members participate in working events throughout the calendar year. We assist with parades, processions, city community events, and anywhere else as needed.

**For duty crews and events, members are able to pick and choose shifts using an employee scheduling app.
