
Background

On December 9, 1956, Longmont lost three young brothers to the waters of a local lake. This incident laid bare a critical gap in our community's emergency response: the absence of trained individuals equipped for such rescue efforts. Recognizing the need for specialized skills and resources, our community came together to establish the Longmont Emergency Unit. Who we're looking for:

Open Water: If you would like to expand your training and experience, we can train you to become a Public Safety Diver. Diving or dive related activities are not required.

Medical Response & Coverage:
Our certified Emergency
Medical Personnel provide
medical coverage for a variety
of special events. Continuing
education credit opportunities
are provided monthly.

Missing Persons: Contribute to search and rescue efforts with our specialized services.

Fire Support Services: Assist local fire agencies at structure fires, wildfires, hazardous material incidents, and mobile air cascade for SCBA tank refills on scene. These are nonfirefighting support activities.

Crime Scene Control: Helping secure the area during S.W.A.T. operations, Meth-lab investigations, underwater evidence search and recovery and other crime scene services.

Traffic Control: Assisting local police and county sheriff's agencies with traffic accidents, parades, power outages, plane crashes, special events, weather related problems and more.
